Deadline for completed applications is June 3, 2025

The Mount Morris Park Community Improvement Association (MMPCIA) \$4,000 Scholarship Award began as a way of honoring the academic accomplishments of college-bound high school seniors who live in or attend high school in the village of Harlem.

The scholarship is awarded in the amount of \$1,000 annually for four consecutive years as long as students remain in school full time.



MMPCIA 2025 College Scholarship Application

Applicant Criteria

- 1. Student must live or attend High School in Harlem
- 2. Student must currently be a graduating senior.
- 3. Students must have a C+ (2.3/77%) or better cumulative high school GPA
- 4. Student must demonstrate financial need via the "Application Print Summary" of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); including the calculated values (family income) and expected family contribution

(EFC). Please contact your guidance counselor for additional support and information.

- 5. Student must provide evidence of community service during high school.
- 6. Student must have a confirmed acceptance to a two or four-year college.
- 7. Student must provide 2 recommendations (see the application checklist on page 4 of this application).
- 8. Student must write a 500-word or fewer essay on the topic provided.
- 9. All applications must be submitted electronically or postmarked via USPS on or before the published deadline.
- 10. Student must be enrolled at the beginning of the fall term following High School graduation.

11. <u>Essay Topic</u>

Please write an original essay of 500 words or fewer on this topic:

Explain your educational and career goals. Describe how this scholarship award will help you meet these goals. Share a story about your recent community service.
